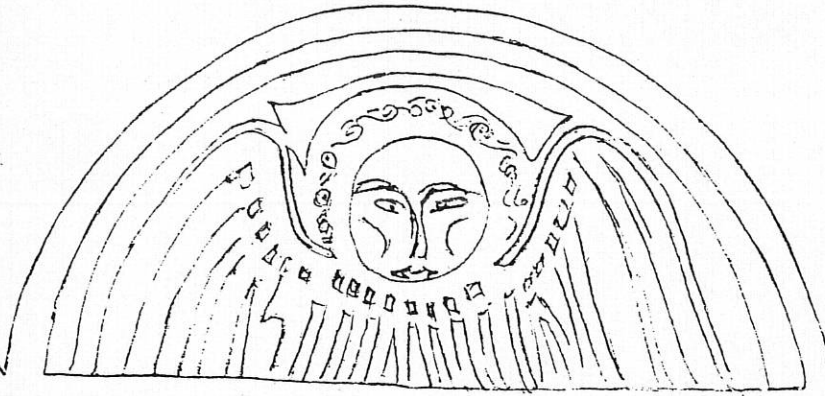

## Introduction

Seemingly since the beginning of time, man has inscribed remembrances of the dead on stones placed in cemeteries to mark the spot of each burial. In times past, these inscriptions were often the only evidence left of a person's existence. In contrast to that, a baby born today is assigned a number almost from birth. In the course of its life, the baby's written record grows to a sizeable dossier so widely distributed that no single fire or flood can destroy it. The stone on the grave, if there be a grave, becomes redundant.

It behooves us, therefore, to preserve the cemeteries that still exist, particularly the ancient ones. A cemetery worth such attention is the Mount Pleasant Cemetery. The purpose of this book is to provide a guide for those who visit it and to record what information still exists before more of it is erased by the passage of time.

In the course of two centuries, over four hundred burials were made. Three hundred forty-five gravestones have been located. About five percent of these stones cannot be identified. Burials were made with the head to the west, feet to the east, and in most cases, the inscriptions appear on the west faces of the stones. Other than a few family plots which are marked with corner stones or low fences, there is no discernible order beyond the general east-west alignment of the graves. Finding a particular grave is difficult.

In order to compile a useful index to reduce this difficulty, a system of grid lines was established at fifty foot intervals with the origin of the grid in the northeast corner of the property on the right-of-way line of New Brunswick Avenue. This street, as it happens, runs as true east and west as the parallel lines of latitude, and thus lines at right angles to the street run true north and south as do the lines of longitude. With the origin in the northeast corner, all graves are west and south of that point and the gravestones are numbered in the order of their western coordinates. Vertical lines carved in the upper rail of the fence indicate by their number the hundreds of feet west of the origin, and the intermediate fifty foot distances are marked by black dots. Reference to the map, knowing the "block" in which a specific grave is located, will give the general area. Locating the western coordinates along the fence and pacing the south coordinate distance away from the fence should place one close to the stone. Stakes once set fifty feet apart from which the measurements were made are gone. Blocks indicated on the map are not evident on the ground.

About 1890, Doctor John Stillwell<sup>1</sup> surveyed a number of cemeteries in the area and listed the graves he found. Little more than a decade later, Miss Helen P. Strong<sup>2</sup> made another list of the burials with a view to finding surviving kin of the deceased from whom to solicit funds for maintenance. From these two lists, together with information on stones erected later, a composite list of persons buried has been compiled. No stones can be found for about fifteen percent of the burials listed. This composite list contains a vast amount of genealogical information even though the stones are now missing or illegible.

It is interesting to take note of the several types of stones found in Mount Pleasant Cemetery. Those of the eighteenth century were of brown sandstone. The lettering on these stones are still sharp and clear except on those few where the face has spalled (split) off. This type of stone is readily carved and the old-time stone carvers included genealogical information, epitaphs, Bible verses and often decorative carvings. For most of the nineteenth century white sandstone was used. It rarely spalls but, commonly, is adversely affected by weathering which reduces the sharpness of the lettering. The stone carvers of the nineteenth century also spelled it out in great detail. Granite was used for gravestones in the twentieth century. Whether from the hardness of the stone, or from custom, carvings are notably reduced. The deceased's name, year of birth and year of death are often all that is recorded. Additional genealogical information must be found elsewhere.

## History

The following is abstracted in part from  
"Presbyterians Pioneer at Matawan"  
Published by the Presbyterian Church, 1959.

In 1685 Thomas Warne erected a wigwam north of Matawan Creek and the following year with his father, Stephen Warne, received a grant from the East Jersey Proprietors of four hundred acres in the area between Matawan Creek and Gravelly Brook. This area became known as Warne's Neck. In the southern portion, one hundred acres (soon to be called Mount Pleasant) were divided into twenty-four long narrow lots forty feet nine inches wide by forty eight hundred feet deep. Each lot fronted on Main Street. These lots were deeded about 1687 to Scotch Presbyterians, some of whom had arrived in Perth Amboy in mid-December 1685, and others who had arrived a few years earlier. The later group had fled Scotland to escape religious persecution under the new king, James II. The king indentured them to George Scott, Laird of Pitlochrie, and gave them (and the Laird) the choice between pledging allegiance to the king or being exiled to the colonies. The Laird and his family, along with many of the passengers and crew, perished on the way to the colonies leaving the survivors free of their bondage.

Previously, Scottish Quakers settled at Topanemas (Marlboro) and more Scotch immigrants arrived later. By 1700 there were Scottish farms strung out from Warne's Neck (by that time called New Aberdeen) through Wickatunk, Topanemus, Freehold and Manalapan and beyond. Old Scots Church was built in Wickatunk at least as early as 1705 and in 1731 Old Tennent Church was erected. Presumably Mount Pleasant Presbyterians met in private homes until about 1734 when a meeting house was built. This date was the earliest given, but the event was not recorded. Some credence was given to this date because it coincided with the decline of Old Scots' and the rise of Old Tennent, over twice as distant from Mount Pleasant. Other historians date the first Mount Pleasant church building about 1760. In 1763 a deed to a one acre lot adjacent to the church was acquired from Mr. Samuel Forman for a burial ground. This land together with the church lot and some subsequent additions and subtractions now consists of 1.88 acres.

By the middle of the eighteenth century, New Aberdeen, including Mount Pleasant, was called Middletown Point and had become the principal shipping point of Middletown Township. In 1767 the Presbyterian Church at Middletown Point along with churches at Shrewsbury and Shark River became the charges of Reverend Charles McKnight. Reverend McKnight was outspoken against the tyranny of King George III and supported patriotic meetings on the church grounds. During the war he served as a chaplain in the Continental Army and was wounded in the Battle of Princeton. In 1777, shortly after that battle, a Tory raiding party caught him at the Mount Pleasant Church. The church was burned and the pastor imprisoned. Ill treatment during his brief imprisonment resulted in his death at his home on January 1, 1778. In May of 1778 a similar raiding party, also seeking a specific patriot, precipitated the skirmish at the Burrowes Mansion.

Twenty-one years after the burning of the church a new one was built on the same property with much of the money being raised by a lottery. This building served for over forty years until a clogged chimney caused such severe smoke damage that the congregation moved out. In January 1842, less than two years later, a third church building, located on Main Street near Church Street, was dedicated. A distinctive tower designed by the architect Stanford White was added in 1892. Thirteen years into the second century of use of this building, it was destroyed by fire, set by an arsonist, on Christmas Day 1955.

Long before the 1955 fire, the use of the Mt. Pleasant Cemetery had declined severely. In the twentieth century less than two dozen burials were made and of these only two persons were interred after the date of the fire. The last grave dug was in 1959, eight months before the dedication of the fourth and present church building on Highway 34 at Franklin Street.

From time to time in the years that followed, one of the local Boy Scout troops would clear away the brush and weeds, but there was more neglect than care. In 1974 when the Borough of Matawan acquired the Burrowes Mansion, the Historic Sites Commission was established to manage that property and other historic places, and in 1978 the Presbyterian Church deeded Mount Pleasant Cemetery to the borough.

Interest was awakened in the cemetery in 1985 when the authors began the work of researching, laying out the grid lines, and measuring the locations of the gravestones. In the fall, the Telephone Pioneers of America selected the cemetery as one of its projects and cleaned it thoroughly. The Historic Sites Commission engaged a painter to coat the stones with a clear water-repelling sealer. The following year saw the completion of the location measurements which was followed by more field work to size, type, and grade the individual stones. Concurrent with this work, a picket fence was built, a number of fallen stones re-erected and broken ones repaired. Borough road department workers now clean the cemetery area more frequently. Instead of a two-acre lot of weeds and tumbled stones, the cemetery is again becoming a place befitting its name.

## Notations Between The Lines

### **Samuel Forman**

The grantor of the cemetery ground, Samuel Forman, lived in the house on Ravine Drive at Wyckoff Street which was used briefly during the Revolution as a hospital. He held the rank of colonel during the war. His daughter, Margaret<sup>3</sup>, married the younger John Burrowes and figured in the 1778 skirmish at the Burrowes Mansion. Her cousin was General David Forman known by the Loyalists as "Black David." Another Forman daughter, Eleanor, married Philip Freneau, the "Poet of the Revolution." Freneau is buried with his mother in what was a family burial ground near his home on Poet Drive. That lot is now owned by the Borough of Matawan. Eleanor is buried with her parents and sisters, Margaret and Mary.

### **Thomas Hunn**

Thomas Hunn<sup>4</sup> lived in what later became known as Hawkins House on Mill Road. He was a member of a group called the "Liberty Boys" and served during the Revolution in the First Regiment, Monmouth County Militia, rising to the rank of Major. He was a principal participant in the skirmish at the Burrowes Mansion. His grave is marked by a large flat white stone which has deteriorated and is illegible.

### **Dr. Peter Le Conte**

His ancestors were French Huguenots who suffered religious persecution stemming from the St. Batholomew's Day Massacre in 1572. Peter's father was Guillaume Le Conte who emigrated to the island of St. Christofer in the West Indies and married Ann Martha Lasty. They moved to New Rochelle, New York in 1689. Peter was born in 1702. He was a physician and moved to Monmouth County about 1730 and in 1735 married Mary Pritard who died in the same year. Soon after the doctor married Valeria Eaton, daughter of John Eaton<sup>5</sup>, the founder of Eatontown. He bought a pew in Old Tennant Church in 1752 and later became an officer in the Mount Pleasant Church and was buried in the church cemetery. His grave is the oldest one known and his gravestone is unique, being of a green-grey color, and has weathered very well. The image of the decorative stone appearing on the cover was reduced from a rubbing of Dr. Le Conte's headstone.

### **Robert Little**

Robert Little came from Ireland following his older brother, William. He was a successful merchant in his brief life in Middletown Point. The two brothers were the first of the Little family for whom a street was named. William outlived Robert by over forty years. He was the postmaster for many years and was the cashier of the Farmers and Merchants Bank, the first bank in Monmouth County, organized in 1830<sup>5</sup>. In 1834 in a room over the bank, classes were conducted in the area's first private school, Middletown Point Academy. In 1835 the academy moved to its own building. A second generation Little, Henry Stafford Little, was among the first pupils.

### **Dr. Thomas Barber**

A Revolutionary War surgeon, Dr. Barber, took part in the Battle of Navesink Hills on February 13, 1777. He died about 1795 and was buried next to his wife and two infant children. There is no gravestone other than the one for his wife. The following anecdote pertaining to the Barber family was found among Miss Helen P. Strong's notes and was ascribed to Mrs. Austin Reid:

"Mrs. Barber's first husband was very tender and careful of her, but he died and (said Sallie Bates) she was foolish enough to marry Doctor Barber. He was a superstitious man, afraid to go out alone at night or to answer a knock at the door, and this woman who had been so shielded had to defend **him**. A child of Mrs. Barber was choked on a cherry pit and in later years, a cherry tree grew out of its grave."

The doctor's behavior might be explained by the fact that he once was severely mugged in New York City by soldiers known to him.

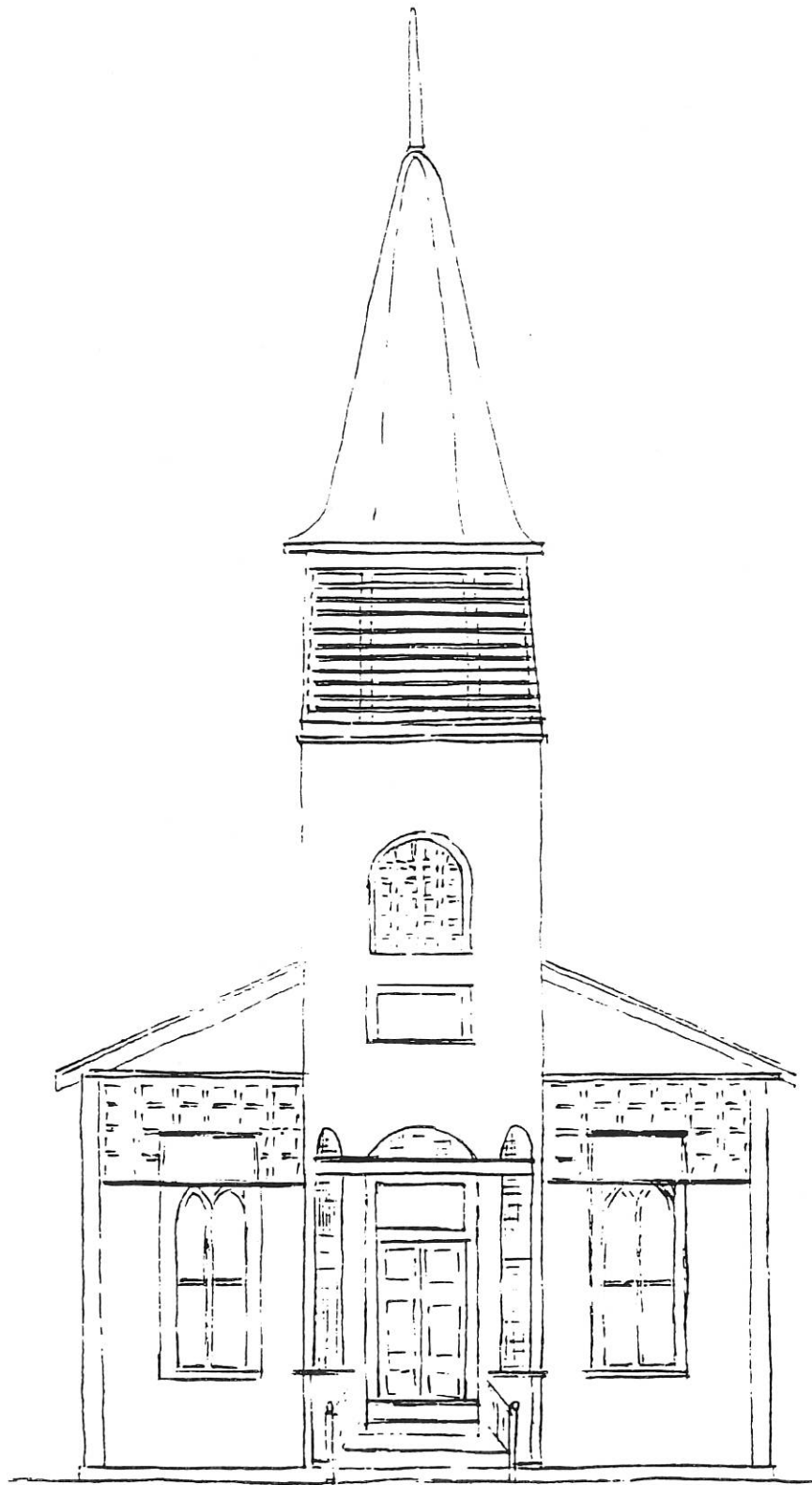
### **Henry Smith**

Among the same notes of Miss Strong was found the following item:

"A Mrs. Rose ran off with a Mr. Wyman and her children dropped the name of Rose for that of Smith with each having an "R" for a middle initial. There was George R. Smith and Henry R. Smith and others."

Henry R. (for Rose) Smith is buried within a few feet of his stepfather, John W. Wyman.

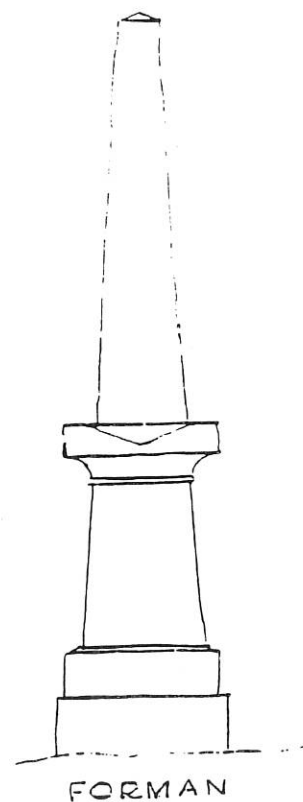
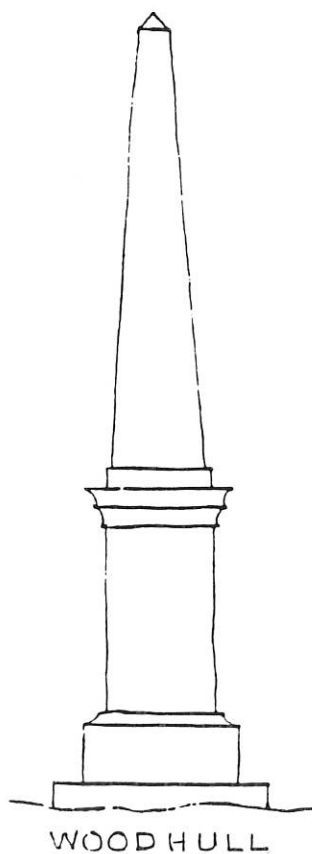
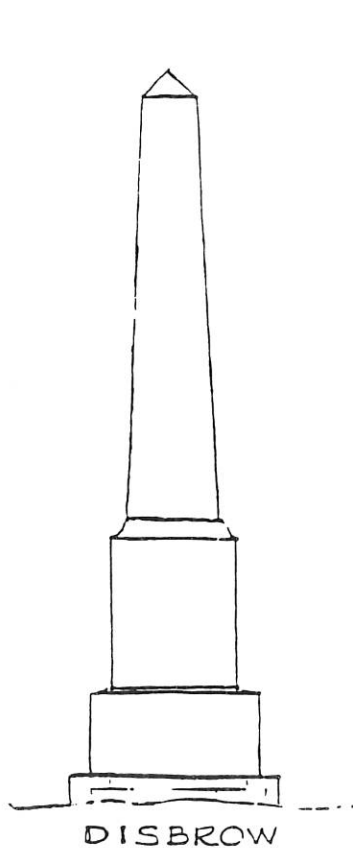
